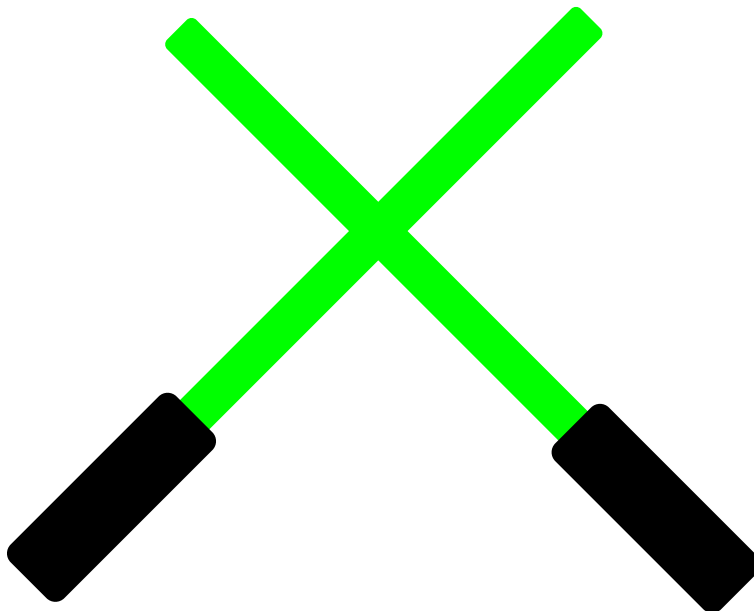


# Jedi Knight Application

# Follow-Up Activity

Use the digits to have your child or student build his or her phone number, using the lightsabers as dashes between the groups of digits, as shown:



0	0	0	0
1	1	1	1
2	2	2	2
3	3	3	3
4	4	4	4
5	5	5	5
6	6	6	6
7	7	7	7
8	8	8	8
9	9	9	9

Another option is to glue the lightsabers in a folder, and laminate the folder. Put sticky Velcro dots where the digits should go in the folder. Put the other side of the Velcro dots on the backs of the numbers (after you laminate them). Each student can use it as a folder game to practice his or her phone number.
