





# Site Plans




#### What is a Site Plan?

A site plan is like a map of a neighborhood or shopping center. The site plan will often show information like buildings, roads, landscaping, and lots.




On the site plan, an architect draws a square or other shape to represent each house, building, road, driveway, yard, tree, park, pond or lake, sewer, and power line.




## A Site Plan is Like a Blueprint or a Floor Plan

A blueprint or floor plan shows the inside of a building or apartment. It is like a map of the inside of a house, office building, apartment, or other building.



## Why Are Site Plans Made?

A site plan shows where to build the buildings, roads, and landscaping. An architect will draw a site plan to get permission to build the neighborhood or shopping center.




After getting permission to build, the site plan is also used for construction.
