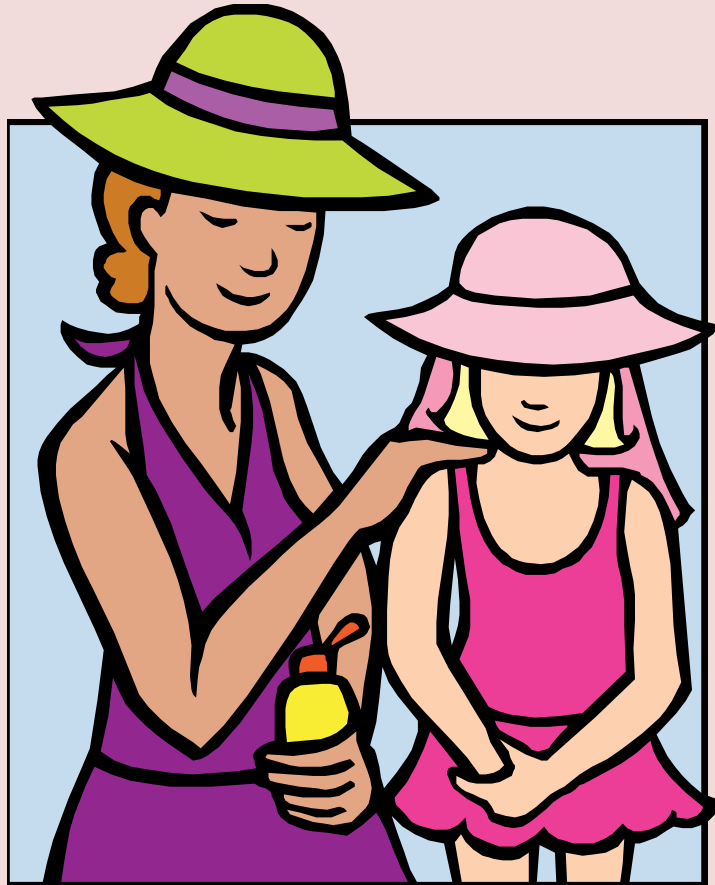


What to Expect on Mother's Day

You can ask your dad, grandma, or other family member what you can do for your mom.



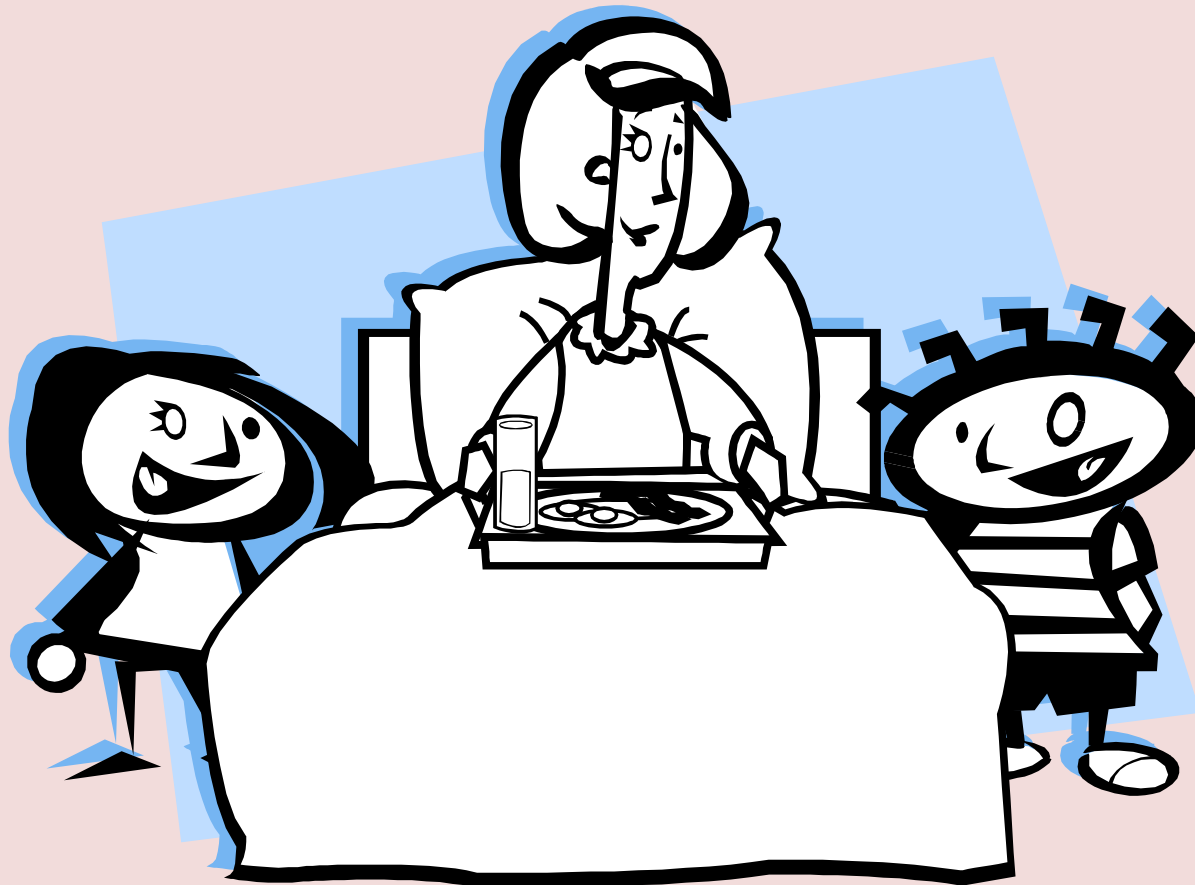
Here are some things kids might do.
