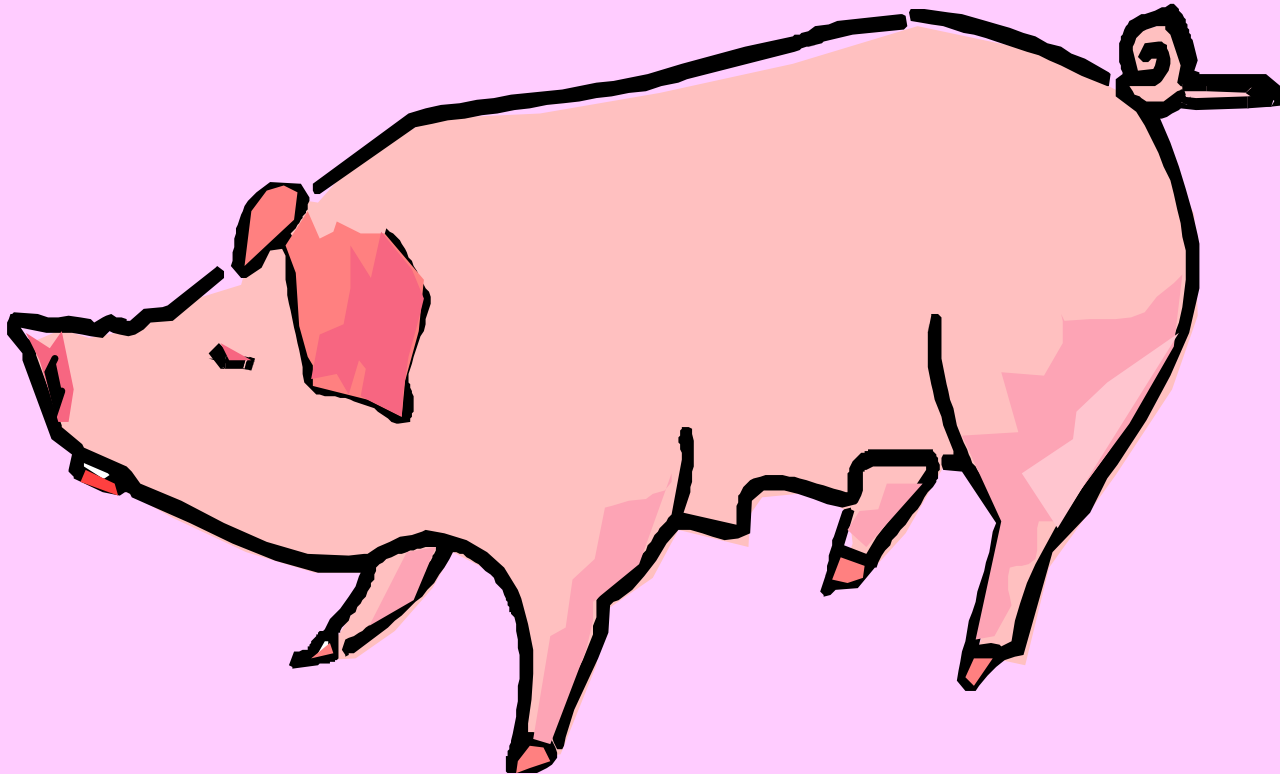

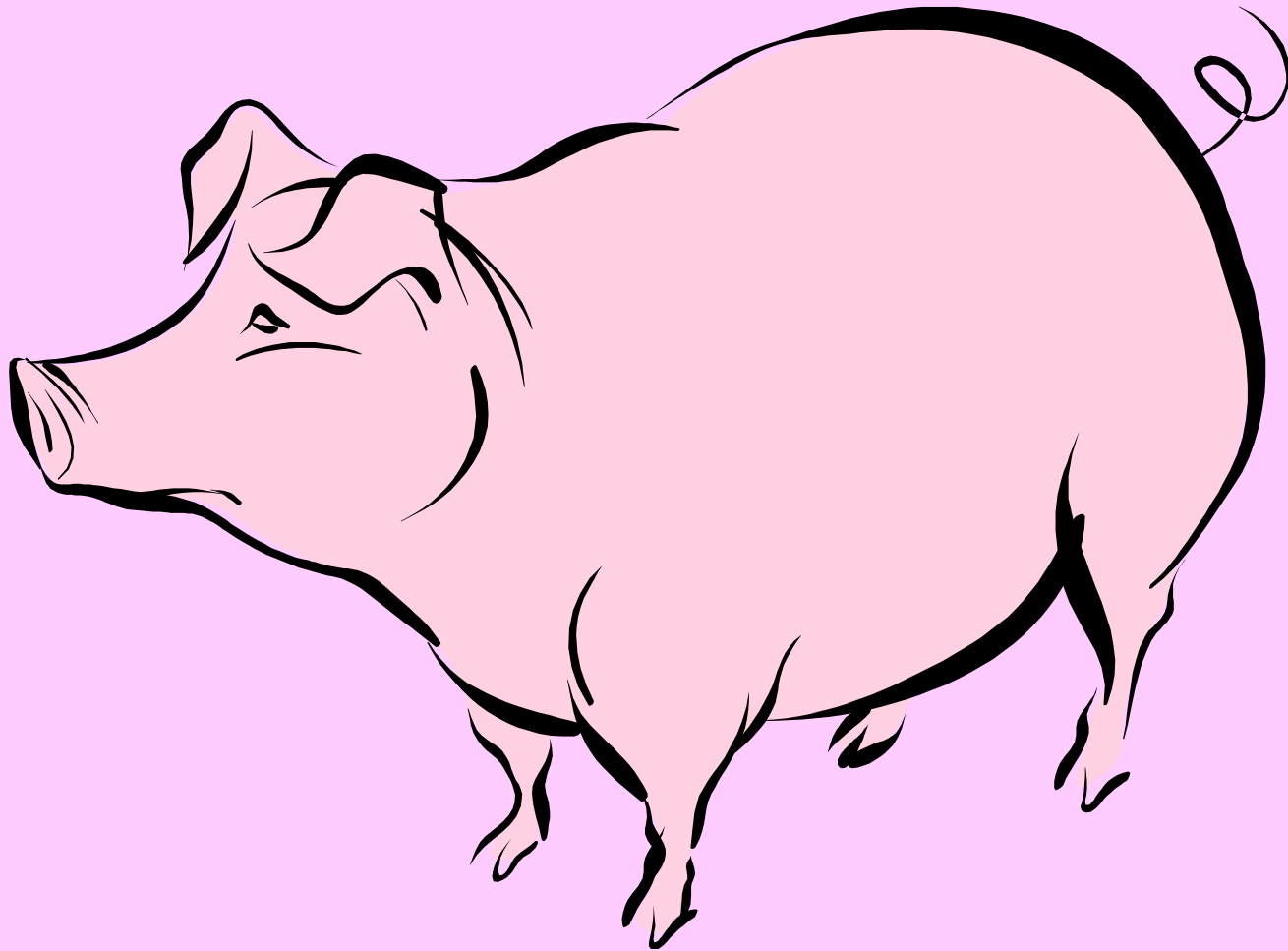

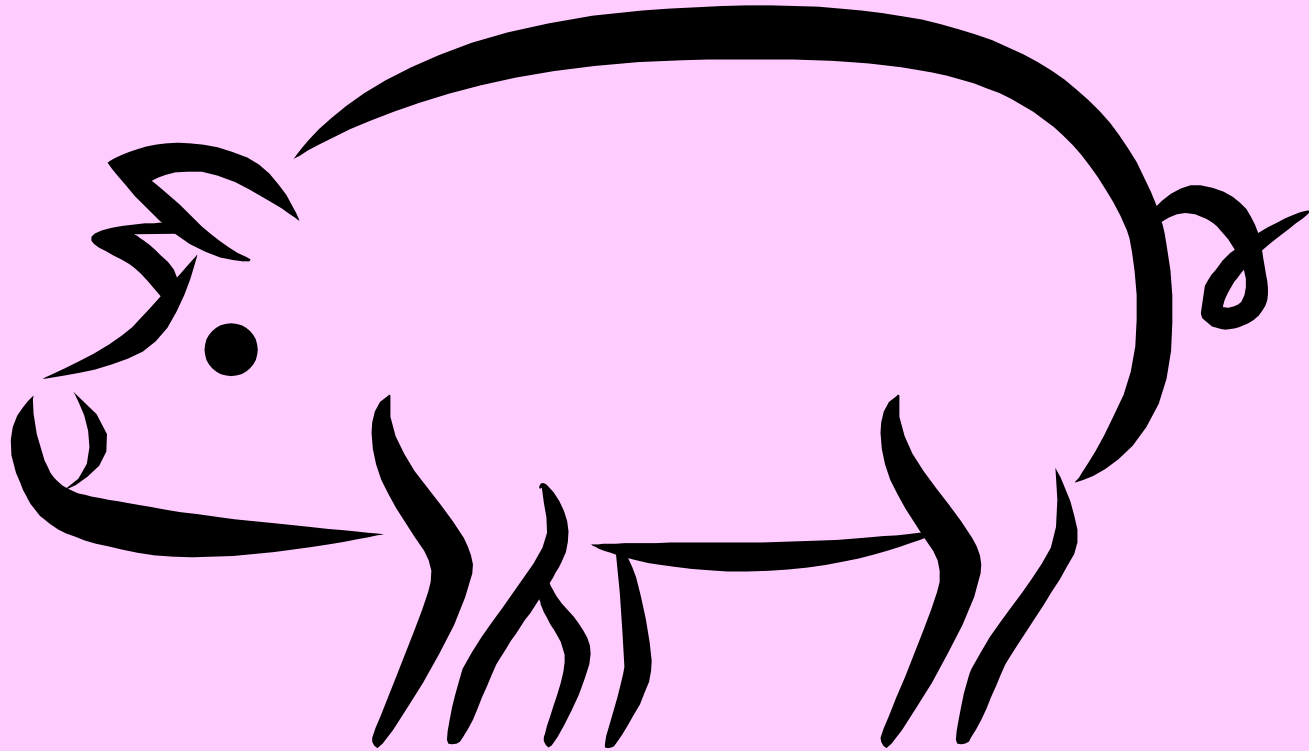

# How to Use

- You can either print the pages out, or show them to the student on a computer, Smartphone, or tablet (such as iPad) for vocabulary development. My students seem to enjoy viewing it on a computer, phone, or tablet, but do whatever works best for your student.
- If your child is working on animal sounds, you can use this as a visual support to use while teaching the animal sounds. I like to use visuals for this (especially when it is taught as in intraverbal in an ABA program) because it helps give the student a picture and some context for the intraverbal. The use this picture support can be faded over time.
- Some of the later pages in this document don't have pictures so that the child has a chance to guess without the visual prompt.
- This book is part of a learning unit on The 3 Little Pigs. I typically do learning units with my students with autism for about 2 weeks to allow for repeated practice of the concepts.
