



Playing Piñata at a Party

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Piñata is a game kids might play at a party.



A piñata is a big paper toy filled with candy or small toys.



A piñata can be many shapes. It can also be an animal or a character.



A piñata hangs from a tree or high place.



To get the candy and toys, kids hit the piñata with a stick. This makes the candy and toys fall out.



On my turn, a friend or adult will put a blindfold over my eyes.



They will spin or turn me around.



I will try leave the blindfold over my eyes and hit the piñata with the stick.



I will try to hit the piñata one or two times, and then give another kid a turn.



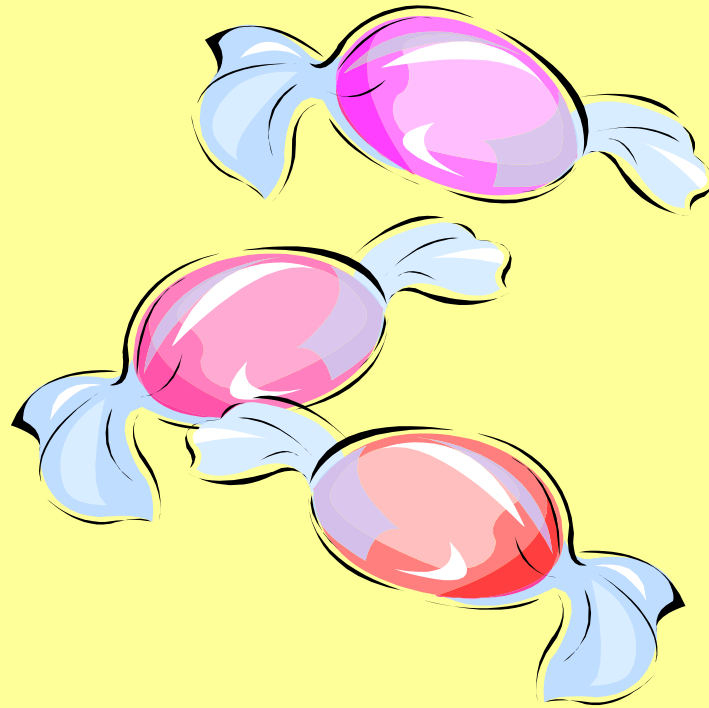
When other kids are hitting the piñata,
