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Going on an Easter Egg Hunt

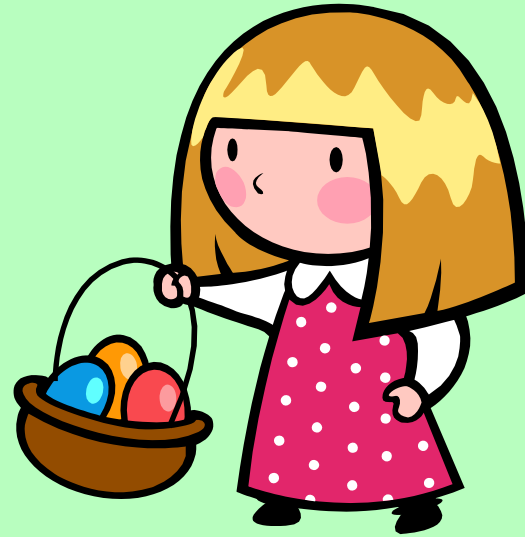
Soon, we will go on an Easter egg hunt.

When I find an egg, I can pick it up and put it in my basket or bucket.



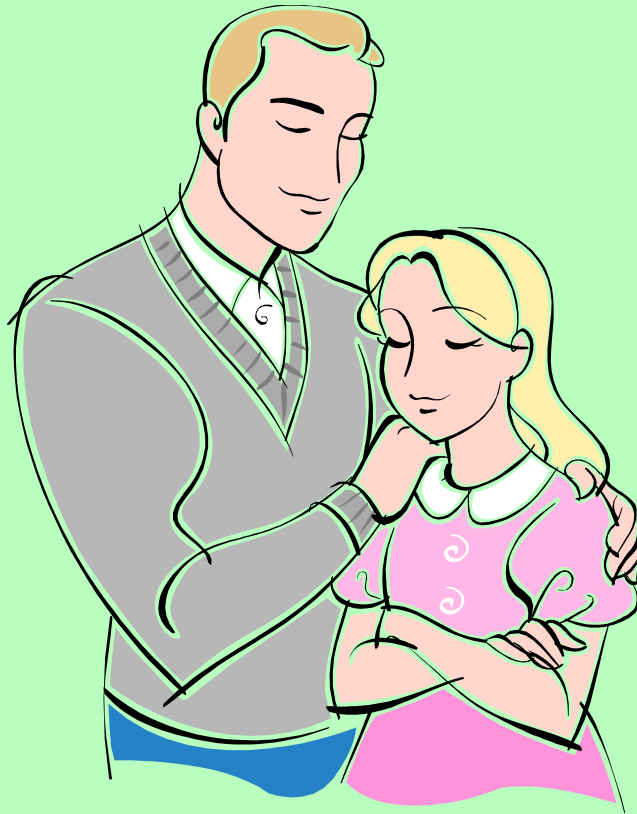
The eggs are for all kids to share. It is okay if other kids pick up eggs too.
